## TREATMENT PLANT RECEIVES CONSTRUCTION AWARD

Ogden City's Water Treatment Plant won the 2015 Utah Construction and Design (UC&D) Most Outstanding Project for Water award. UC&D annually honors projects from various industries throughout the State. The project was selected due to the challenging nature of its construction.

The new Treatment Plant is able to produce 13.5 million gallons of water per day (MGD), operates seasonally to meet peak demands in the summer months, and utilizes microfiltration technology to produce a more reliable and safer quality of water.

## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS: FLOOD SAFETY TIPS

Everyone should understand the flood risk for their home and property. Remember Homeowners insurance doesn't cover flooding unless you have specific flood insurance.

### If flooding is likely:

- Listen to the radio or television for information
- Do not walk through moving water. Six inches of moving water can make you fall. If you have to walk in water, walk where the water is not moving.
- Use a stick to check the firmness of the ground in front of you.
- Do not drive into flooded areas.
- If floodwaters rise around your car, abandon the car and move to higher ground if you can do so safely. You and the vehicle can be quickly swept away.
