Open burn period is March 30 to May 30. Burn permits must be obtained prior to burning and cost \$5. To obtain a permit, call the Ogden City Fire Department at 801-629-8074.

Items that may be burned are thoroughly dry clippings, bushes, plants, and tree prunings from property cleanup.

FREE DUMP PASSES FOR OGDEN CITY RESIDENTS

Ogden City is offering its citizens up to two free dump passes to the Weber County Transfer Station good for a total of 280 pounds each of waste disposal. The passes will help residents dispose of items that are not allowed in the Dial-A-Dumpster program or at the Green Waste Facility.

Passes are available through July 1 and can be picked up at the Community Service Building (1875 Monroe Blvd.) or the Public Works Building (113 West 29th).

Please bring a picture ID. You must have a water account with Ogden City to qualify for a dump pass. Learn more about the dump pass program, Dial-A-Dumpster program, and the Green Waste Facility at www.ogdencity.com or by calling 801-629-8271.

FREE TREES AVAILABLE TO CITY RESIDENTS

Free trees are available at no cost from the Ogden City nursery beginning April 2 for planting in the parking strip of Ogden homes. The nursery is located inside the Green Waste facility at 1845 Monroe Blvd. About 200 trees will be distributed on a first-come-first-served basis, limited to one tree per household. Residents must provide information about overhead power lines, the width of their parking strip, and the lot location. Bring identifying documents, such as a current Ogden City utility bill and a current Utah driver's license. For more information, call 801-629-8231.



The Green Waste facility also has an abundance of premium compost, wood chips, and mulch for sale by the bag or yard. Compost costs \$15 per yard or \$3 per bag. Wood chips are \$10 per yard, and mulch is \$7 per yard.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS: HOUSEHOLD CHEMICALS

Knowing how to handle hazardous household chemicals and how to react during an emergency can reduce the risk of injury.

Follow these guidelines to stay safe: Buy only as much of a chemical as you think you will use. • Keep products containing hazardous materials in their original containers and never remove the labels unless the container is corroding. • Never mix household hazardous chemicals or waste with other products. • Follow the manufacturer's instructions for the proper use and cleanup of the household chemical. • Never smoke while using household chemicals. • Dispose of hazardous materials correctly. The Weber County Transfer Station has a household hazardous waste collection program that runs every third Saturday of the month between April and September from 8am-1pm. • Post the number of emergency medical services and the poison control center by all telephones.

If someone has been exposed to a household chemical: Find any containers of the substance that are readily available in order to provide requested information and call 911.
