

## GET INFORMED AT FY2017 BUDGET OPEN HOUSE

You are invited to attend an open house regarding the Mayor's proposed FY2017 budget. This includes a proposed property tax increase to more adequately fund police and fire salaries and expenses. The property tax increase is close to the amount of a General Obligation Bond that is expiring this year and is anticipated to have little to no net impact on residents. The open house will be held on July 26 from 5-6 p.m. at the Ogden Municipal Building (3rd floor).



The City Council will also receive public input during a Truth in Taxation hearing that will be held in the Municipal Building on August 9, 2016 at 6 p.m. and will adopt a final FY2017 budget during this meeting.

## FIRE AND FIREWORKS RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT

Through July 31, the use of any open flame or firework device is strictly prohibited in all areas east of Harrison Boulevard, all wooded areas and parks along the river corridors, all of Fort Buenaventura, the dog park and baseball park located off of A Avenue, the old landfill property located at approximately 2550 A Ave., and all open fields, vacant lots, wooded areas, and brush-covered hillsides throughout the city. ## DON'T LEAVE YOUR PET IN THE CAR

High temperatures can cause irreparable organ damage and even death, and studies have shown that rolling down your window does little to reduce the car's temperature.

### If you see an animal trapped in a hot car:

1. Take down the car's make, model, and license-plate number.
2. If there are businesses nearby, notify their managers and ask them to make an announcement to find the car's owner.
3. If the owner can't be found, call the police non-emergency number (801-395-8221) or Animal Services (801-629-8244) and wait by the car for them to arrive.



## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS: EXTREME HEAT

Most heat disorders occur because the victim has been overexposed to heat or has over-exercised for his or her age and physical condition. Older adults, young children and those who are sick or overweight are more likely to succumb to extreme heat.

**To prepare for extreme heat:** Install window air conditioners snugly; insulate if necessary. • Install temporary window reflectors to reflect heat back outside. • Weather-strip doors and sills to keep cool air in. • Cover windows that receive morning or afternoon sun with drapes, shades, awnings, or louvers. • Keep storm windows up all year. • Listen to local weather forecasts. • Get trained in first aid to learn how to treat heat-related emergencies.

**During a Heat Emergency:** Never leave children or pets alone in closed vehicles. • Stay indoors as much as possible during the warmest part of the day and limit exposure to the sun. • Eat well-balanced, light, and regular meals. Avoid using salt tablets unless directed to do so by a physician. • Drink plenty of water; even if you do not feel thirsty. Avoid drinks with caffeine. • Limit intake of alcoholic beverages.

• Dress in loose-fitting, lightweight, and light-colored clothes that cover as much skin as possible. • Check on your loved ones regularly.
